With all these back ground, this year, the department of Community Medicine had successfully organized the sensitization session on Research Methodology under the leadership of Dean, Dr. Abha Singh Madam, Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur among M.B.B.S. Final part-I students on 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> September 2019 in presence of Head of the department Dr. Nirmal Verma, all the faculties and post graduate students of the department in lecture hall 4, Medical College Building.

The session was started with the briefing of the State Level Dissemination Workshop for Undergraduate Medical Students on Research Studies in Public Health" organized by Department of Community Medicine for the last year research projects along with the photos of the event was done by the Head of the department.

The session was further continued by the faculties and post graduate scholar explaining about what is research, purpose of research, how to identify the public health problems, how to frame research question, objectives, sampling methods, sample size, summary, conclusion and recommendations. They were also told about how and on what headings one should write a research project.

In July 2019, total 150 students of M.B.B.S. final Part -I (admission year -2016) were divided into total 15 groups each group consisting of 7-10 students for conducting research activity. Every project groups were supposed to do their project work under the mentorship of respective faculties and postgraduate student. Mentors has been allotted to all the groups of students.
