Background

“One Health” is a globally recognised approach that emphasises the interconnectedness of human health, animal health, and environmental health. It has gained significant importance in addressing emerging public health threats such as zoonotic diseases, antimicrobial resistance (AMR), and ecological imbalances in alignment with the national initiative led jointly by IAPSM and ICMR, the Department of Community Medicine, Pt. J.N.M. Medical College, Raipur, organised a series of academic activities to promote awareness and strengthen interdisciplinary understanding of the One Health framework.

Under the esteemed guidance of Associate Professor & Head, Dr. Shubhra Agrawal Gupta, the department conducted a Continuing Medical Education (CME) session on 13th November 2025, titled **“One World, One Health: United for Human–Animal–Environment Well-being”**. The programme was organised in collaboration with the Departments of Microbiology and Pharmacology, ensuring a multidisciplinary academic platform. The CME aimed to sensitise medical students, postgraduates, and faculty members about the urgent need for collaborative approaches in addressing public health challenges that span across species and ecosystems.

As part of the ongoing One Health awareness initiative, the department also organised One Health Quiz. The quiz was conducted under the leadership of the Head of Department and with the support of all faculty members of Community Medicine. The activity was designed to enhance conceptual clarity, promote competitive learning, and engage undergraduate MBBS students in an interactive format. Students from multiple batches registered for the event, and the quiz incorporated key domains of One Health, including zoonoses, environmental determinants, integrated surveillance, and AMR.

The initiative received enthusiastic participation from MBBS students, postgraduate residents, and faculty members. The successful conduct of both the CME and Quiz reflects the department’s commitment to strengthening One Health literacy and contributing to national capacity building in public health.
